# Lenten Dietary Regulations for all Catholics and the Paschal Fast

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence from meat. Fasting allows for a single full meal and two lesser meals. The Fridays of the season of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. Abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. Fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday.

The Second Vatican Council also urged: "Let the Paschal Fast (this is not the penitential fast of Lent) be kept sacred. Let it be observed everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, as a way of coming to the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection with uplifted and welcoming heart" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 110).

<u>Lent ends with sundown on Holy Thursday and the Triduum begins, from sundown on Holy Thursday to sundown on Easter Sunday.</u> These are the three holiest days in Christendom.

- Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.



#### Reporting Child Abuse



Victim-survivors of clergy sex abuse have the right to report their stories. We are here to help, listen, and connect them with the right services. Report all allegations concerning the abuse and /or neglect of minors to the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) Hotline (1-800-25-abuse) and /or the local police department first before reaching out to the Archdiocese of Chicago Office for the Protection of Children and Youth (OPCY). To report historical abuse in the Archdiocese of Chicago, please contact OPCY at 312-534-5254. We also encourage victim-survivors to connect directly with leaders from the Office of Assistance Ministry, a division of OPCY that provides care, support and resources to victim/survivors of clerical sexual abuse, and their loved ones, in their efforts to achieve psychological, emotional and spiritual healing.
