


OUR THREE TEMPTATIONS

We are all made in God’s image and likeness, blessed, and our private secret that we are special is, in fact, the deepest truth. However, that isn’t always easy to believe. Life and circumstance often tire us in ways that tempt us to believe its opposite. It happened to Jesus.

During his baptism, Jesus heard his Father say: “You are my blessed son, in whom I take delight.”

But throughout his life Jesus struggled to always believe that. For instance, immediately after his baptism, we are told, the spirit drove him into the desert where he fasted for forty days and forty nights – and afterwards “he was hungry”. Obviously what scripture is describing here is not simply physical hunger. Jesus was empty in ways that made him vulnerable to believe that he was not God’s blessed child.

Jesus was first tempted by the devil in the desert, to this effect: “If you are God’s specially blessed one, turn these stones into bread.” In essence, the devil’s taunt was this: “If you believe that you are God’s specially blessed creature, why is your life so empty?” Jesus’ reply, “One doesn’t live on bread alone!” might be rendered: “I can be empty and still be God’s blessed one! Being blessed and special is not dependent upon how full or empty my life is at a given moment!”

It is good to remember, namely, that we are God’s special, blessed sons and daughters, even when we lives seem empty, anonymous, and devoid of any special privileges because then we won’t forever be putting God and our restless hearts to the test, demanding more than ordinary life can give us.

Dear Fr. Joe and parishioners of St. Matthew's Parish in Schaumburg (IL),

Fr. Evandro Miranda Rosa, C.R., our Vicar General, recently sent me information that St. Matthew's Parish in Schaumburg, IL has generously donated \$600 US to our Resurrection Mission in Tanzania, East Africa. Fr. Evandro asked me if I would like to write a letter of gratitude, which I am thrilled to be able to do on behalf of our Resurrectionists in Africa and our entire Resurrection community!

Fr. Joe, you might remember that I have taught Theology at Mount St. Mary's University in Emmitsburg, MD for 25 years now. I had a sabbatical during the 2019-2020 academic year, and I had planned on making a visit to Tanzania of about 2-3 months. But—surprise—our Superior General, Fr. Paul Voisin, C.R. asked me if I would consider staying for a year in Tanzania to help with the African mission. In particular, I was asked to serve as the rector of our formation house in Morogoro, while Fr. Andrzej Duda, C.R. (the usual rector) led the novitiate of 10 novices in Buhemba. Well, I have been here for over 11 months now, and I am now readying myself to return to the USA in a few weeks to resume teaching.

This has been a life-changing experience for me. Like other Resurrectionists and parishioners in North America, I constantly pray for vocations to the Congregation and to the Church. Like many good Catholics, I did not think that my prayers were being answered. But, coming here, I realize that they are being answered, just not like I had anticipated! The Church is alive with vocations here in Tanzania. We now have 15 young men in formation at various stages, included Phillip Justinian who will be ordained to the transitional diaconate on July 11 in preparation for his priestly ordination next year. Already the first Tanzanian

Resurrectionist under perpetual vows, Phillip will become our first Tanzanian Resurrectionist priest in about a year. We also have many candidates who are interested in joining us in the future. Just this past week, we hosted, for a week, a young man from Morogoro who would like to join our Congregation.

Fr. Joe, all these great happenings would not be possible without the spiritual and financial support of you and your parishioners. You can imagine the costs for the education, food, health care, and clothing that your donations have supported here in the seminary. I must admit that I am particularly moved by your generosity during our pandemic. In the midst of your discomfort and distress, your parish community continued to reach out to those less fortunate. And indeed, many people here, while making the most out of life with a joy that is often times hard to fathom, are living day to day as they look for safe drinking water, enough food for the simplest of meals, and wood or coal to start a small cooking fire. I have seen first-hand how our two priests, Fr. Daniel Hinc, C.R. at Our Lady of Precious Blood of Jesus' Parish in Butiama and Fr. Maciej Braun, C.R. at St. John Paul II Parish in Buhemba are working to support the spiritual, educational, and human needs of their parishioners and those in their parish areas. As rector of our formation house, I can also assure you that the Tanzanian men in formation are committed to continue this good work in Tanzania.

So, thank you for your prayers. Know that they are being answered! Thank you for your generosity. Know that God will never be outdone by it! Thank you for your interest and support. Know that it is appreciated and that we will keep you in our prayers as gracious benefactors.
